Owning a home with an affordable payment leads to family stability for generations. It means parents have resources to buy nutritious food and cover medical costs, and kids have a safe place to study at night.

95 local families have purchased a Black Hills Area Habitat for Humanity home and 33 families have had their homes repaired. Their hard work and partnership with us help them achieve independence for their families. Habitat homeowners are prepared for success with extensive training and an affordable mortgage.

22 families have paid off their mortgage.

\$160.000 paid by Habitat homeowners in property taxes each year.

\$237,120 savings on utility costs each year.

\$570,000 saved by Habitat homeowners in housing costs each year.

every family deserves a second chance



When one reflects on "perseverance," one may envision unwavering diligence and triumph over insurmountable obstacles. We envision Antonia. Antonia has experienced many setbacks while in the Habitat program; some that could have meant her story would not end in success.

Like many families in the area, her living conditions were not ideal and she dreamed of creating a better life for her family. Life altered, Antonia divorced and her once idle dreams for her family turned into a priority matter. Antonia took the first step by attending a Habitat Informational Meeting in 2013.

This meeting ignited a spark and Antonia pushed forward; she completed her application and was accepted into the program. Antonia partnered with Habitat to work toward providing stability and self-reliance for her family, but again, she experienced another setback. She had nearly completed the program when she became ill and was hospitalized. She had been determined and steadfast but the illness stole her momentum and for nearly a year her dream was placed on hold.

Antonia remained focused and worked with Black Hills Habitat on a long-term plan to stay on track while dealing with her illness. On August 28, 2015, Antonia accepted the location of her new home and is expected to move into her home in early 2017. "I want my children to always have a place to call home," declares Antonia. Because of Antonia's perseverance, that declaration will become a reality.







More than 750 people volunteered with Black Hills Area Habitat for Humanity this year – completing more than 20,000 volunteer hours.

Volunteers helped ReStore process 7,732 donations, keeping 160,690 pounds of building materials out of landfills and creating \$132,000 to help serve Black Hills Area Habitat families.


