Building Independence


On the inside of Charla Henk's wrist, July 11, 2009 is scrawled in bold cursive writing. "I called it my independence day," she said, moving back her bracelets to further reveal the tattoo. It was the day Charla's Habitat home was dedicated and she moved her four children out of her parent's basement and into rooms of their own. Habitat was Charla's opportunity to put the past behind her and though many unforeseen challenges lay ahead, the experience resulted in strengthening her

daughter, Heather, who would grow up to become strong, resilient, and self-reliant. For Heather, "Independence Day" meant saying goodbye to the volunteers who ate pizza with her on the floor, adopting her first cat Skittles, and starting over in a new school. On her first day she met Page, and when Page's mom offered her a ride home, the girls realized they lived on either side of the twin home. As time went on, their friendship blossomed and while their request to put a door between the two homes was denied, their promise to be each other's bridesmaids would eventually come true.

As Heather found herself settling into a new routine, Charla began experiencing some health concerns, disrupting her ability to consistently work. Reflecting on all the hard work her mother put into the house, Heather, who was only 14 at the time, found the strength to step up and contribute with her brothers. Together, the family maintained their home for ten years.

As Heather wrapped up her college degree, and prepared for her upcoming nuptials, the family came to another crossroads.

Seeking support in her day to day routines and more companionship while Heather was at work, Charla made the brave decision to move to an assisted living facility. Looking back on the blessings their home provided,



Heather decided the right decision for their family was to donate their home back to Habitat and let another family build their own memories.
